The Investigator carries Jacques Lurton's vision to put Kangaroo Island on the world map of fine wine. Made from 100% Cabernet Franc The Investigator 2008 combines old and new world, strength and delicacy, power and elegance.

In 1802 HMS Investigator carried Captain Matthew Flinders on a voyage which included the first European discovery of Kangaroo Island. Two hundred years later, French winemaker Jacques Lurton also landed on Kangaroo Island.

After two decades making wine around the world, Jacques carefully selected a schist and clay terroir in the centre of Kangaroo Island and established a diverse boutique vineyard. Jacques chose Kangaroo Island for its beauty, freedom and maritime climate, similar to vineyard conditions where he grew up on the French Atlantic Coast.

Just as HMS Investigator helped Matthew Flinders put an unknown land on the map, The Investigator carries Jacques' vision for a flagship to sit amongst wines from the great regions of the world and etch Kangaroo Island onto the world map of wine.

Wine Notes:

The Investigator 2008 is the most robust flagship release to date. Made from 100% Cabernet Franc, Jacques describes The Investigator 2008 as the most Australian of the four flagship releases so far. Very subtle hints of classic varietal leafiness on opening builds to reveal blackcurrant, plum and mulberry fruit flavours. Offering beautiful balance and a thoroughly composed structure characterised by long, fine tannins and a sublime finish, The Investigator 2008 continues to build a legacy as Kangaroo Island's top wine.
